

COACHES MEETING

The NBCAHOF will conduct a pre-tournament meeting to review tournament procedures, local rules and items of importance to for this event. All coaches are **required** to attend. The pre-tournament meeting will be at 4 p.m. on Thursday September 26, at the Summer Grove Golf Club Clubhouse.

PRACTICE ROUND

One 18-hole practice round must be scheduled with the Summer Grove staff.

In an effort to maintain the conditions of the course and speed of play, each player may play only one ball during any practice round, except each player may chip or putt more than one ball on or near the green only. Each participant must play from the designated tees.

Teams are limited to five players during practice rounds. Groups of six are not allowed, and coaches are not allowed to play during any practice round.

Coaches will be provided time schedules and be responsible for monitoring pace of play. Practice-round pairing and tee times will be determined by reserving your tee time with the Summer Grove staff at– 770-251-1800.


There will be Dasani Water, Powerade, fruit and snacks available throughout the golf course for participants and coaches.

TIEBREAKER

Tiebreaking Procedures

Team ties shall be broken by a sudden-death playoff counting the low four scores relative to par on each hole. Play shall continue with new scoring on each successive hole until a winner is determined. The games committee will determine the starting holes. If a playoff involves more than two teams, a shotgun format shall be used. The team playoff will be conducted first, with the playoff for individual spots to follow immediately after the conclusion of the team playoff. Once the shotgun sudden-death format is started, that format shall be used until a winner is determined.

SCORING

Scorecards for the NBCAHO Invitational shall be kept in strict accordance with Rule 6-6 of the USGA's 'Scoring the Stroke Play'. The scorecard shall be deemed returned to the golf committee when it is placed by the player or coach in the box located in the designated scoring area. (USGA Scoring Rules below)

6-6. Scoring in Stroke Play

a. Recording Scores

After each hole the marker should check the score with the competitor and record it. On completion of the round the marker must sign the score card and hand it to the competitor. If more than one marker records the scores, each must sign for the part for which he is responsible.

b. Signing and Returning Score Card

After completion of the round, the competitor should check his score for each hole and settle any doubtful points with the Committee. He must ensure that the marker or markers have signed the score card, sign the score card himself and return it to the Committee as soon as possible.

Penalty for Breach of Rule 6-6b:

Disqualification.

c. Alteration of Score Card

No alteration may be made on a score card after the competitor has returned it to the Committee.

d. Wrong Score for Hole

The competitor is responsible for the correctness of the score recorded for each hole on his score card. If he returns a score for any hole lower than actually taken, **he is disqualified**. If he returns a score for any hole higher than actually taken, the score as returned stands.

Exception: If a competitor returns a score for any hole lower than actually taken due to failure to include one or more penalty strokes that, before returning his score card, he did not know he had incurred, he is not disqualified. In such circumstances, **the competitor incurs the penalty prescribed by the applicable Rule and an additional penalty of two strokes for each hole at which the competitor has committed a breach of Rule 6-6d.** This Exception does not apply when the applicable penalty is disqualification from the competition.

Note 1: The Committee is responsible for the addition of scores and application of the handicap recorded on the score card - see Rule 33-5.

33-5. Score Card

In stroke play, the Committee must provide each competitor with a score card containing the date and the competitor's name or, in foursome or four-ball stroke play, the competitors' names.

INDUCTION CEREMONY

Over the past years these outstanding Alumnus were inducted into the National Black College Alumni Hall of Fame during the HOF Weekend. Notables among the inductees were the Jones Brothers, which consist of six brothers (the only know family in the world) where six siblings played a professional sport. Also prominent among the inductees were former New York Mayor, David Dinkins; former surgeon general, Regina Benjamin; film producer, Will Packer; renowned musician, Will Downing; community service activist, Elisabeth Omilami; Brigadier General, Clara Adams-Ender; the first African American to own a company that exceeds two billion in annual revenue, Janice Howroyd; and the Honorable Tommie Colbert, Sr. Atlanta retired television news anchor Monica Kaufman Pearson of WSB TV, served as the emcee, and jazz saxophonist Mike Philipps provided entertainment.
